## Obituary.

The death of Mr. CYRUS REDDING is announced by telegraph. He was a native of Peury, Cornwall, England, born in 1785. In 1806 he removed to London, and from that time until 1815 he was a contributor to a number of publications. From 1815 to 1818 he edited *Galignani's Messenger*. In 1820 he became coeditor with CAMPBELL, of COLBURN'S *New Magazine*, and gave a pleasing sketch of the author of *The Pleasures of Hope*; in that periodical. He established several papers. Among his works are *Gabrielle, &c.*, *Poems*, published in 1829; *History of Wines and Shipwrecks and Disasters at Sea*, in 1833; *Velasco; or, The Memoirs of a Page*, in 1846; *Abstract of Evidence on the Wine Duty*; *Keeping up Appearances: a Novel of English Life*; *Yesterday and Today*; *Pandurang Hari*, an Eastern story.
